LET'S GET STARTED

1. Paper Plate Picholis:

Let the child paint designs on paper plates, add glitter if desired. Once dry, string them together for a festive garland.

2. Colorful Handprint Tree:

Dip hands in different colors to create a colorful tree on paper. Add leaves for detail.

3. Fabric Tie-Dye Flags:

Secure fabric with rubber bands, apply paints, mist with water, and let dry for unique flags.

4. Recycled Bottle Lanterns:

Paint bottles, cut out shapes, decorate, and string together for lanterns. Add fairy lights for a magical touch.

5. Seed Paper Seedlings:

Blend newspaper and paper towels with water, add seeds, shape with cookie cutters, dry, and hang to sprout into plants.

- Get messy: Encourage creativity and enjoy the process.
- Recycle & Reuse: Utilize materials already at home for eco-friendly crafts.
